

# Prints from the Age of Rodin



Presented in conjunction with *RODIN: TRUTH, FORM, LIFE / Selections from the Iris and B. Gerald Cantor Collections* (Walsh Gallery, September 13 – December 21, 2019), *Prints from the Age of Rodin* features lithographs and etchings by the great sculptor's contemporaries, including Berthe Morisot, Henri Toulouse-Lautrec, and Félix Vallotton.

Drawn from the museum's permanent collection, with selected items on loan from the Jundt Art Museum at Gonzaga University, the exhibition features views of the urban environment, portraits of artists, writers, and thinkers, and theater playbills and advertisements that illuminate the rich cultural atmosphere of late 19th- and early 20th-century Paris.
