OHIO STATEHOOD

OHIO WAS ORIGINALLY A PART OF NORTHWEST TERRITORY ESTABLISHED IN 1787. IT WAS ORGANIZED INTO COUNTIES AS UNITS OF GOVERNMENT BY Gov. St. CLAIR IN 1789. HEADQUARTERS WERE IN CINCINNATI UNTIL 1799 WHEN CONGRESS DESIGNATED CHILLICOTHE AS THE CAPITAL. OHIO BECAME A STATE MARCH 1, 1803. THE CAPITAL WAS MOVED TO COLUMBUS IN 1817.
