When Fairfield was established in 1942, the first task for its founding Jesuits was to convert the physical infrastructure of two private estates into the campus of a boys' preparatory school. In addition to renovating the existing buildings, the founders needed to purchase a wide array of furnishings in order to create classroom and residential facilities in McAuliffe and Bellarmine Halls. Fairfield's growth and development soon required new buildings, beginning with Berchmans and Xavier Halls in 1947 and 1948. By the end of Rev. William C. McInnes' tenure as President in 1973, further additions had included Loyola Hall (1955), Canisius Hall (1957), Gonzaga Hall (1957), Alumni Hall (1959), Campion Hall (1964), Regis Hall (1965), the Campus Center (1966), Jogues Hall (1968), Nyselius Library (1968), Kostka Hall (1971), Claver Hall (1972), and Bannow Science Center (1971).

**Historical Note**

When Fairfield was established in 1942, the first task for its founding Jesuits was to convert the physical infrastructure of two private estates into the campus of a boys' preparatory school. The grand mansion formerly belonging to the Jennings family would become McAuliffe Hall, the site of Fairfield's first classes. On the former Lashar estate, another stately home would become Fairfield's Bellarmine Hall, the Jesuits' first campus residence. In addition to renovating these buildings, the Jesuits also needed to purchase a wide variety of appropriate furnishings, everything from tables and chairs for the classrooms to an altar for the Jesuits' domestic chapel.

By 1945, it was apparent that more buildings would be needed, especially as the plan to open a new University progressed. Accordingly, Fairfield's second Rector, Rev. James H. Dolan, S.J., commissioned a master plan from architect Oliver Reagan (see Box 1, Folder 4). In line with this vision of a Gothic-style campus, Fairfield's first new buildings were constructed in 1947 and 1948: Berchmans Hall (originally referred to as the "freshman-sophomore" building) and Xavier Hall (originally the "senior-junior" building, although also intended for the use of undergraduates). While most of the rest of Reagan's plan went unrealized, Berchmans and Xavier continue to form the core of the Fairfield Prep campus today.

In the mid-fifties, with Fairfield University thriving, the next additions to the campus were Loyola Hall (1955), Canisius Hall (1957), and Gonzaga Hall (1957). In addition to adding student residence space, Loyola housed the University chapel until the opening of Egan Chapel of Saint Ignatius Loyola in 1990. Gonzaga provided additional student housing as well. Canisius added classroom space while also serving as the site of the University Library until the new Nyselius Library building opened in 1968.

In 1963, Fairfield commissioned a study from Taylor, Lieberfeld and Heldman, Inc., a Toronto-based architecture firm that specialized in aiding institutions of higher education to evaluate their physical plant and land requirements. Delivered in 1965 (see Series Seven below), the report advises Fairfield on future land use and physical plant development under a variety of enrollment growth scenarios.

An additional residence hall (Campion) opened in 1964, and the need for more student living space would only increase over the decades to follow. New student residences opened in 1965 (Regis), 1968 (Jogues), 1971 (Kostka), and 1972 (Claver). The 1980's would see the addition of the Townhouses complex, with units built in 1982, 1984, and 1987.

Other landmark construction projects through the late 1980's included Alumni Hall (1959), the Campus Center (1966), Nyselius Library (1968), the Bannow Science Center (1971), the School of Nursing Building (1977), the RecPlex (1979), the Center for Financial Studies (1979), Donnarumma Hall (1981), and the Regina A. Quick Center for the Arts (1989).

### **Scope and Contents**

This collection combines several different sets of documents pertaining to the construction, renovation, decoration, or furnishing of Fairfield's campus buildings or other physical facilities. Overall, the contents include building specifications; blueprints and other technical drawings; vendor catalogs and brochures; master planning documents; internal planning and committee records; correspondence with architects, engineers, vendors, artists, zoning authorities, religious authorities, and potential donors; donor prospectuses; programs from dedication events; and notes from subsequent research on certain campus buildings.

Series One: Furnishings, Renovation, and Construction, 1942-1950

The materials in Series One largely document the extensive refitting that was required to establish classroom and residential facilities in McAuliffe and Bellarmine Halls between 1942 and 1945. Some records pertaining to construction and furnishing projects in the later 1940's are present as well. The contents of the files include correspondence with contractors and vendors; product brochures; handwritten notes and lists; building specifications; and technical drawings made by architects, engineers, and decorative artists.

Items of particular note include a 1920 blueprint diagram of electrical panels for the Lashar residence (Box 2, Folder 23); architect Oliver Reagan's initial letter introducing himself to Rev. John J. McEleney, S.J., in 1942 (Box 1, Folder 5); a series of three letters from Frank M. Travis of Torrington, Conn., in August 1942 concerning the introduction of water lilies into Bellarmine Pond (Box 1, Folder 1); a letter from Dr. James P. McManus of Bridgeport registering his son David for the fall of 1942, with expressions of appreciation to the Jesuits for "establishing this much needed educational facility in our midst" (Box 1, Folder 3); a drawing of Oliver Reagan's 1945 master plan for Fairfield, with a draft article describing the plan by Rev. James H. Dolan, S.J., intended for publication in the Christmas 1945 issue of the *Bellarmino Quarterly* (Box 1, Folder 4); a series of blueprint diagrams (1945 and circa), primarily from Thomas and Company of Worcester, Mass., showing the proposed designs of religious items and decorative elements for the two campus chapels (Box 2); and a 1946 set of specifications for the construction of Berchmans Hall (Box 1, Folder 9).

Series Three: Nyselius Library Building Committee, 1964-68

The files in this series document the activities of the Library Building Committee before and during the construction of Nyselius Library. The creator of the files is not certain, but it appears likely they were maintained by Rev. Francis A. Small, S.J., Fairfield's head librarian from 1952 until his death in 1974.

The materials present include: background information on academic library design; a questionnaire circulated to the faculty in November 1964 and the results of that questionnaire as tabulated in December 1964; copies of a 1965 report entitled "Preliminary Building Program for New Fairfield University Library Building"; correspondence between Fr. Small and Rev. William C. McInnes, S.J., Fairfield's President from 1964 to 1973; correspondence with Eggers and Higgins Architects (including a signed copy of their September 1965 contract and a January 1966 set of preliminary drawings); correspondence from the summer of 1966 among Fr. McInnes, New England Jesuit Provincial Rev. John V. O'Connor, S.J., and the Superior General of the Society of Jesus, Rev. Pedro Arrupe, S.J., concerning permission for the library project; correspondence between Eggers and Higgins Architects and prospective subcontractors; bid tabulation sheets; fundraising materials; materials related to University's need to seek a zoning waiver from the Town of Fairfield; and materials related to the April 1967 groundbreaking ceremony.

Also of interest in Box 4, Folder 1 is a 1960 letter from Rev. John V. O'Connor, S.J., then Rector of Weston College, to Rev. James E. Fitzgerald, S.J., Fairfield's President from 1958 to 1964, suggesting that the theological works of Rev. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, S.J. "should not be handed out for everyone's reading" but should instead be "carefully scrutinized by competent Jesuit teachers and read only under their direction" (Box 4, Folder 1).

Series Four: President’s Office Files on Physical Plant 1957-1971

The files in this series appear to have been maintained as a unit by the President’s Office during the tenure of Rev. William C. McInnes, S.J. (1964-1973), although they include some documents of slightly earlier date. The content is varied by project, but overall, the files include correspondence; floor plans and other architectural drawings; cost estimates; loan applications; legal papers; press clippings; and materials from dedication ceremonies.

Of particular note: Folders 10 and 11 provide extensive documentation of planning for the construction of the “Northwest Dorm” (Jogues Hall), including Fairfield’s need to apply to the Town of Fairfield for a zoning exception and its difficult negotiations with neighbors opposed to various aspects of the project. Folder 11 includes a signed copy of a settlement between the University and a group of Fairfield residents who had brought suit to contest the favorable zoning decision, as well as a letter from the Town Plan and Zoning Commission confirming approval of revisions to the zoning exception according to that agreement. It also includes a particularly irate letter from one near neighbor (George P. Norton), suggesting that the Town of Fairfield zoning commission is unfairly biased in favor of Catholics, and that the University is purposely taking advantage of this situation. His subsequent letter offering a partial apology is present as well.

Folder 10 includes correspondence seeking permission for the project from the New England Jesuit Province and the Jesuit Superior General.
