About Donald Woods

- A 5th generation South African, Woods was Editor-inin-Chief of the Daily Dispatch. He was prosecuted by the State 7 times for editorial criticism of apartheid.
- In 1977 he was arrested and banned for publishing details of the killing of his friend Steve Biko.
- After personal attacks on his family by police, he escaped with his wife and 5 children. He now resides in London.
- He is Director of the Lincoln Trust which supplies information about apartheid to the international media.
- He is author of *Biko*, translated into 12 languages; *Asking for Trouble*, an awardwinning autobiography, and *Black and White*.
- Woods' escape from South Africa is the subject of a British docudrama recently shown on US Cable Network.
- The story of his life, produced and directed by Sir Richard Attenborough,

(Ghandi), will be distributed by Universal Studios next year.
