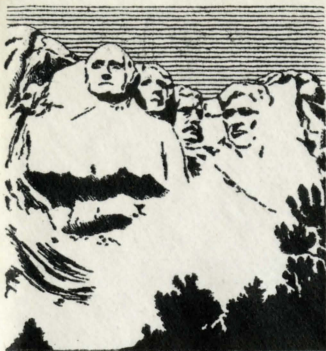

MOUNT RUSHMORE, IN THE BLACK HILLS OF SOUTH DAKOTA HAS AN ALTITUDE OF 6200 FT. ON THE GRANITE FACE OF THE MOUNTAIN ARE CARVED THE HEADS OF WASHINGTON, JEFFERSON, LINCOLN AND THEODORE ROOSEVELT OF A SIZE PROPORTIONATE TO MEN 465 FT TALL. THE PROJECT WAS CONCEIVED AND, IN THE MAIN EXECUTED, BY GUTZON BORGLUM. BECAUSE OF ITS PATRIOTIC CONCEPTION IT IS RAPIDLY BECOMING KNOWN AS THE SHRINE OF DEMOCRACY.
