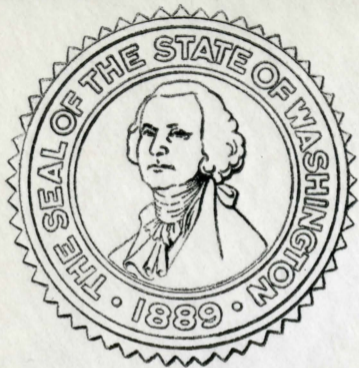

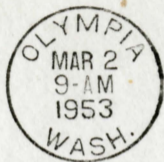

WASHINGTON TERRITORY WAS ORGANIZED IN 1852 IN A REGION EXPLORED EARLIER BY CAPT ROBERT GRAY, GEORGE VANCOUVER, LEWIS AND CLARK AND OTHERS. IT WAS FIRST SETTLED IN 1811 WHEN DAVID THOMPSON ESTABLISHED A FUR-TRADING POST NEAR THE PRESENT SITE OF SPOKANE. WASHINGTON BECAME A STATE IN 1889.
